A Midsummer Night's Dream is one of the world's most famous plays. The legend says that at any given moment, this Shakespearean classic about a love square, the rulers of Fairyland and an ass is being performed somewhere in the world. Right now, it is about to be brought to life through song, dance and verse by an incredibly talented cast of passionate young people in front of your very eyes. Let them enchant you with this story about our very world and our troubled times. Our interpretation focuses on a society that desperately needs to hear the call of nature, and to heal its disruption through a deep re-wilding. Nestled in the heart of the Celtic natural world, at the boundary between Shropshire and Wales, between the human world and the Otherworld, is the waterfall of Pistyll Rhaeadr. It sang to us songs of legends, mischief and love, it whispered to us of its sprites and queens, and led us through its fairy bridge to a place where magic reigns supreme. And now, we cannot wait to share this dreamy journey with you. VICTORIA GARTNER - WRITER & DIRECTOR

Victoria Gartner is an award-nominated writer, director and teacher. Over the last ten years, she has written and directed work produced in the UK, Switzerland, Germany and the Netherlands. She is the Artistic Director of Will & Co. which she founded in 2015. Her most recent project, Bard in the Yard, was developed in the first Covidinduced lockdown of May 2020. These two solo plays about Shakespeare experiencing writer's block during the Elizabethan plaque have been performed in private gardens, schools, care homes and festivals by many actors all over the UK to great public and critical acclaim (The Guardian, The Telegraph, The Independent). Dame Helen Mirren is the Godmother of the project. Other work by Victoria includes Will or Eight Lost Years of William Shakespeare's Life, which has toured Europe in both French and English, Verona (Theatre tribühne, Stuttgart) and Judith & Hamnet (Lausanne Shakespeare Festival). Victoria has been teaching Shakespeare for many years, giving workshops in schools and universities, including at the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust and East15 Acting School, where she is currently teaching acting and directing Shakespeare. She is passionate about giving everyone access to words in a fresh and vibrant way, using the body as well as the mind to unlock the verse. She started her directing career as Assistant Director for opera company NOF on works such as Acis & Galatea and Blanche Neige. Victoria was born in Ukraine and grew up in the French-speaking part of Switzerland before moving to the UK. She has an MA in English literature with a specialisation in Shakespearean studies as well as a degree in Dramaturgy and Directing, and is part of the Authentic Artist Collective.

JOEL HALL - COMPOSER, MUSICAL DIRECTOR & DIGITAL PRODUCER

Joel Hall is a Composer, Musical Director and Digital Producer who trained at the University of Nottingham and Royal Birmingham Conservatoire. He is a Digital Producer at the Royal Shakespeare Company and the Director of StreamPark, an award-winning interactive digital events

platform partnered with the Mixed Reality Lab at the University of Nottingham, Live Cinema UK and Oxfam GB, funded by Horizon Digital Economy Research and hosting immersive events for national organisations, theatres and communities. Joel is also working as a Digital Producer for Watford Palace Theatre's upcoming production of The Merchant of Venice starring Tracy-Ann Oberman. Joel's musical The Terrific Trevils with book and lyrics by Tom Ling premiered at the Watford Palace Theatre as the UK's first interactive 'Musical in a Book'. Performed by West End and touring actors and introduced by awardwinning radio and TV presenter Clive Anderson, the show was created with the Woodland Trust to inspire and educate young people about the beauty and importance of woodlands. Joel has also scored and musically directed Robin Hood with associate director Jonny McClean for the Lichfield Garrick Theatre; Baba Yaga with director Victoria Gartner for British Youth Music Theatre; The Big Red Rock - A Little Musical for Child's Play Ltd and Inspire Culture Learning and Libraries; Judgement Day under the direction of John Adams at the Patrick Centre, Birmingham Hippodrome; The Flying Frog at Nottingham's Royal Concert Hall online; Grandma Claus at Aylesbury Theatre; and many other productions. Joel is writing songs for *The Last Vampire*, having undertaken a R&D workshop at Coventry Belgrade Theatre, led by the Belgrade's creative director Corey Campbell, musical director Steve Edis and writer Chris Monks. The musical is based on a series of popular books by Joel's grandfather, playwright Willis Hall. Joel has also written music for Paramount Theatre's Connection Concert Series directed by New Works Development Director Amber Mak and he has performed for Peter Pan: A Musical Adventure at the Chicago Shakespeare Theatre online. Joel occasionally works as a pianist for the Nottingham Playhouse having accompanied Olivier award-winner Jenna Russell as Edith Piaf and multi awardwinning duo George Stiles and Anthony Drewe's Identical directed by Sir Trevor Nunn.

KATHERINE MORAN -CHOREOGRAPHER

Katherine works as an actor, choreographer, movement director and voiceover artist. She attended her first local dance class in Pinner aged four and went on to train as an actor at the Royal Central School of Speech & Drama. She has since combined her dance technique and acting experience to work on productions including Lysistrata (The Cockpit), Two the Power of Three (Theatre Handmade) and Mortal (Excitus Productions). Katherine is also a Movement & Dance Lecturer at the London College of Music, and choreographs her own work. In acting, Katherine's credits include Call The Midwife (BBC), A Christmas Gift From Bob (Lionsgate), and News Revue (BBC/Canal Cafe Theatre). She is currently writing her first play, Ruthless, which tells the true story of Ruth Ellis from Ruth's perspective. When she's not running around a rehearsal room, Katherine is probably chatting into a microphone for her voiceover business, voicing tor recent projects for Groupon UK, Vrbo, Raw Fury Games and Yves Saint Laurent.

MITCH BROOMHEAD - LIGHTING DESIGN & PRODUCTION MANAGER

Mitch has been working in technical theatre, stage and production management for over 25 years. She trained at Rose Bruford College of Speech and Drama and graduated with a Diploma in Technical Theatre Arts in 1993 having specialised in Lighting and Lighting Design. Since 2014 she has been working mainly in technical, stage and production management roles for touring theatre productions and music festivals, as well as being the current resident lighting designer for Regent Opera Company, with whom she has just lit and toured *Carmen*. This is her fourth production with BYMT and A Midsummer Night's Dream is her favourite Shakespeare play so she is really pleased to be able to design the lighting for it.

EDWARD ATKIN - ASSISTANT MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Edward Atkin is an award-winning composer and performer who is currently studying at Guildhall School of Music and Drama where he has lessons with Julian Phillips. His music has been performed by world class ensembles such as the ORA Singers and the BBC Concert Orchestra. He holds a professional scholarship position with the London Oriana Choir and was previously a scholar at Sheffield Cathedral. He is thrilled to be taking on this role with British Youth Music Theatre, in his first musical theatre engagement since the beginning of the pandemic.

ALEXANDRA KAY - ASSOCIATE DESIGNER

Alexandra is a Costume, Set and Puppetry Designer Maker who is a current final year Design for Performance student at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama. Her previous credits include work as a scenic and costume assistant on RWCMD (Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama) productions of Shook, Dream, The Marriage of Figaro and Mary Stuart to name but a few. She has worked extensively as a design assistant and previously designed a production of 'The Pillowman' before starting her training. She is thrilled to be associate designing this production of A Midsummer Night's Dream with British Youth Music Theatre as part of the Creative Trainee Scheme. When not covered in paint in a design studio or running around a theatre , she can be found working as an illustrator and animator in her spare time.

IZ BRETT - DEPUTY STAGE MANAGER

Iz Brett is an aspiring Stage Manager who is about to enter their 2nd Year at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. They have been involved with the technical aspects of theatre since Year 7 and fell in love with Stage Management during Year 10 with their school's production of Little Shop Of Horrors. Since then, they've Stage Managed many school productions and are currently working towards graduating with a BA in Production Technology and Management.
